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Welcome

The LPC is immensely proud of all the hard work and amazing patient care that was delivered during 2022 by Thames Valley Pharmacies, a year that will go down in history as one of the toughest ever for community pharmacy – starting in January with the Omicron variant of Covid-19 fuelling the pandemic, and ending in December with a Strep-A outbreak and severe shortages of antibiotics.

So, what does 2023 have in store? The first quarter requires you all to make your PQS submissions and complete year 4 of the CPCF, with April commencing with the current contract's final year. The new Oral Contraceptive service will go live nationally in the next couple of months, we are piloting additions to NMS for Anti-Depressants in some pharmacies in Frimley, and we will be asking interested pharmacies across Thames Valley to take part in the Early Cancer Diagnosis Trial – more info to follow soon.

As a result of the National RSG Vote in June 2022, some things will have to change at local LPC level. A larger part of the levy that is paid to the LPC will now go to the PSNC (rebranded as Community Pharmacy England from April) and this means that our income will be reduced. We are already one of the most efficient LPC's in England, with our levy being amongst the lowest, and we are investigating ways of becoming even more efficient. We have approached Bucks LPC to ask their contractors if they would like to merge with Pharmacy Thames Valley. Pooling our resources would result in economies of scale for all our contractors. Also, in line with our Constitution, we will shortly be appointing a new LPC Committee, so do listen out for your opportunity to represent your fellow contractors across Thames Valley.

We are also working closely with BOB and Frimley ICS's to ensure that community pharmacy is well represented at all levels in the instigation and implementation of local healthcare services. To help us with this, each ICS has recruited a Community Pharmacy Integration Lead to enable us to capitalise on any opportunities that may exist. To this end, I would like to welcome Subrina and Yinka who will be working for BOB and Frimley respectively (see page 3). Finally, in light of the current financial challenges, we are aware of a large number of sales of pharmacies that are progressing at the moment and we look forward to welcoming those new owners/pharmacy teams to the Thames Valley community.

Contractor Support Officer Update

Happy New Year! I wanted to take this opportunity to update you on GP CPCS across our patch. There has been a massive increase in referrals since BOB ICB starting using EMIS/ PharmOutcomes in April 2022 so well done to everyone, particularly given the increased workload from September on. Looking at the detail, over the past 9 months, our 15 Top Performing pharmacies have completed an average of 157 referrals each, with only around 6 not completed, earning them over £2,000 per pharmacy. At the other end of the scale, our 15 Lowest Performing pharmacies missed out on over £13,000 of income which is very disappointing when other income streams are reducing. So, I wanted to share some tips from our top performers:

- Have PharmOutcomes open all the time and make sure a member of the team checks the system at least 5 times a day.
- 2. For morning referrals, phone the patient by the end of the day, and by the following morning for afternoon referrals. If you can contact the patient sooner, well done as you will be exceeding the patient's expectations.
- 3. Depending on the minor ailment, either do the consultation over the phone and complete PharmOutcomes, or invite the patient into the pharmacy for a consultation in your consultation room.
- 4. In the event of an unplanned closure, make sure you amend your DOS right away as this will stop referrals being made to your pharmacy, so patients will not be disappointed.

NHS Shared Email



A reminder that it is a contractual requirement to regularly access and use your NHS shared mailbox. This is now a key communication tool for referrals and vital communications, and all pharmacies should have a routine in place for checking and managing the account at regular intervals throughout the day.

Oxfordshire Hospital Discharge Report



Healthwatch Oxfordshire has just completed a report outlining the experiences of patients discharged from the Churchill, Horton, John Radcliffe or Nuffield Orthopaedic Centre hospitals with prescribed medicines. This was in response to a request from OUH to gain insight into patient experience of its Patient Medicines Helpline, which provides patients leaving hospital with medicines with support via email and phone from a pharmacist. 113 patients took part in the survey, with a key finding being that few respondents had heard of the Helpline. They also identified other themes around clear and timely communication about medicines and discharge waiting times.
